A regular part time position is available for a Nurse Practitioner who is able to function capably in the Inpatient Unit. The NP in the Inpatient Unit will provide direct, specialized, comprehensive nursing assessments, case management, lifestyle counselling, education and referrals emphasizing health promotion and disease prevention strategies to positively affect health outcomes. The NP coordinates patient care to facilitate continuity of care for non-acute and/or chronic inpatients working collaboratively with the interdisciplinary team to assess, plan, implement and evaluate clinical interventions. The NP acts as a liaison and consultant to other health care providers and ensures best practice in a manner consistent with the Mission, Vision and Values of the hospital. The NP orders, interprets, and records results of clinical tests and prescribes medications and treatments within the scope of practice according to the College of Nurses of Ontario. This position is responsible for comprehensive nursing care as established by the standards of nursing practice of the College of Nurses of Ontario and according to the policies and procedure as set out by HWMH.

Hours of Work:

18.75 hours per week, days to be determined.

- Minimum 3 years relevant clinical experience as a Nurse Practitioner required
